

the Cuban Five for a definitive solution, while they requested their support in order to be granted visas to entry the United States to visit their husbands.


Olga stressed that the supervised freedom regime endured by Rene constitutes a legal absurdity that does not comply with any purpose and unnecessarily prohibits his return to his Homeland and reunite his relatives. Adriana requested a humanitarian gesture that requires the political willingness and ethics of the United States Government.

Mrs. Pillay acknowledged the visa denial as a violation to the human rights and expressed this cannot constitute an additional punishment.

Ciego de Ávila, Cuba, Mar 5 (Prensa Latina) Women in this city staged a march today to support the five anti-terrorist Cuban fighters unfairly held in US prisons since 1998.

As part of the International Campaign Five for the Cuban Five, housewives, workers, students and fighters demonstrated to demand the return home of Gerardo Hernandez, Rene Gonzalez, Ramon Labanino, Fernando Gonzalez and Antonio Guerrero.

The Cuban Five, as these heroes are known worldwide, were detained and given harsh prison sentences for monitoring Miami-based violent groups acting against Cuba.

Four of them still remain in US jails while Rene Gonzalez left prison in 2011 after serving his sentence and was given an additional three-year supervised release punishment.

Organized by the Cuban Institute of Friendship with the Peoples and the Federation of Cuban Women, the demonstrators also repudiated terrorist actions committed against several nations worldwide.

Participants read poems, letters and texts sent by The Cuban Five to people living in this province, and a simultaneous chess match called Checkmate for The Cuban Five.

Vancouver Cuban 5 Action Report Backs: 5th of each month for the Cuban 5!

88th Vancouver Monthly Protest

On Tuesday March 5th, 2013 the

Free the Cuban 5 Committee-Vancouver gathered once again for the 88th monthly protest to free the 5 Cuban Heroes held in U.S. jails. This protest took place at a very difficult time however, as immediately preceding the protest the world found out some very painful news. That the president and leader of the Bolivarian Revolution in Venezuela, Hugo Chavez had passed away.

The protest, once gathered, paid homage to the great revolutionary and supporter of the Cuban 5. And with the spirit of Chavez and the pain of his physical loss, the protestors began there chanting more energetic than ever in front of the U.S. consulate demanding justice and freedom for the Cuban 5.

The first speaker of the program was David Whittlesey, an organizer with the Free the Cuban 5 Committee-Vancouver and veteran of the U.S. Civil Rights Movement. David gave a history of the Cuban struggle against terrorism from groups in the U.S., which led to the Cuban 5's mission in Miami.

Nestor Otero, organizer with the Free the Cuban 5 Committee-Vancouver spoke next, starting his talk with a loud energetic chant of "Free the Cuban 5 Now!" Nestor was resolute in his clear demand to Obama to "Free the 5".

After an energizing round of picketing, protestors gathered in to hear from Tamara Hansen, coordinator of Vancouver Communities in Solidarity with Cuba (VCSC). Tamara spoke about the coming of International Womens day and the significance of that day for the case of the Cuban 5. She explained that the wives, mothers, daughters and families of the Cuban 5 are struggling everyday for the return of their loved ones.

Noah Fine, coordinator of the Free the Cuban 5 Committee-Vancouver, spoke to wrap up the monthly protest inviting people to join with the committee on the 5th of each month to protest until all 5 Cuban heroes are free in Cuba.

Vancouver Supporters of the Cuban 5 gather for 89th Monthly Protest!

On Friday, April 5th, a group of activists and supporters of the Cuban 5, coming from all ages and communities, gathered in front of the U.S. Consulate to demand freedom for the 5 Cuban political prisoners held in the U.S.

The lively protest began with the reading of a powerful poem written about the 5 Heroes by Cuban poet Gustavo Aragón Esquivel and addressed to the Vancouver protest. The poem, in its entirety is posted below this report.

After the words from this powerful poem, Cuban 5 supporters began their picketing of the U.S. Consulate with loud chants of, "HEY OBAMA, FREE THE CUBAN 5!"

The first speaker of the program called in to the protest from San Francisco, California. Alicia Jrapko, coordinator of the International Committee to Free the Cuban 5 spoke to the Vancouver gathering explaining the tragic news of the death of the father of Cuban 5 hero René González. René, who is waiting out an unjust 3 year probation in Florida after finishing his prison term has requested an emergency condition to be able to travel to Cuba to be with his family in its time of grief. So far, Alicia explained, the permission has not been granted

The next speaker in the program was Tamara Hansen, coordinator of Vancouver Communities in Solidarity with Cuba (VCSC). Tamara spoke on the situation of two of the wives of the Cuban 5, Adriana Pérez and Olga Salanueva, wives of Gerardo Hernandez and René González respectively. Tamara explained how the U.S. government has denied all requests by those two women to visit their husbands in prison. A denial illegal by the U.S. and international law. She also announced that Adriana Pérez will be speaking in Vancouver later this month about the case of her husband and the 5 Cuban Heroes which is being organized by the United Steelworkers (USW) union.

The protest was brought to a close by Free the Cuban 5 Committee-Vancouver coordinator, Noah Fine. Noah closed by announcing that the next monthly protest will be marking 90 months of consecutive protest at the U.S. Consulate. He also committed that the group would continue to gather on the 5th of each month to protest until all 5 Cuban Heroes are released from prison.
