



INTERNATIONAL SOLIDARITY COLLOQUIUM BEGINS!

September 11, 2014

In order to establish dialogues and facilitate new solidarity actions for the release of Gerardo, Antonio and Ramón, still imprisoned in the U.S., the 5th International Solidarity with the Five and Against Terrorism Colloquium began today, and will run through September 12.

With more than 200 participants from 49 countries, the Colloquium will open with the inauguration of exposition Absueltos por la solidaridad, 16 watercolors painted by Antonio Guerrero from prison; and be followed by a screening of Justice in London, by film maker Roberto Chile - showing the efforts of a London based Investigation Committee into the case of the Cuban Five, and which includes testimonies from witnesses, family members, victims of terrorism, investigators, lawyers and judges. The final conclusions of the investigation will also be read during the event. A panel discussion with the Five's family members and activists will take place in the morning, while the afternoon will be dedicated to another discussion involving family members of victims of terrorism and a summary of the main proposed activities to be included in the event Plan of Action.

Closing remarks and summaries will be presented Fernando González, vice president of ICAP who, together with Colloquium delegates, will meet with members of Vedado CDRs in the evening.

On September 12, a tour around the University of Computer Sciences (UCI), University of Havana, José Antonio Echeverría Higher Polytechnic Institute and the Union of Cuban Journalists (UPEC) will take place, in order for participants to share experiences and speak with students, teachers and intellectuals.

At 2pm, delegates will visit the exposition No agradezcan el silencio by Alexis Leyva (Kcho), on display in the Museum of Fine Arts, reflecting the inhumane imprisonment suffered by Gerardo, Antonio, René, Fernando and Ramón.

fight against apartheid; he is known for his modesty, simplicity and serenity; his in-depth analysis and extensive knowledge of international affairs; his firmness and discipline; and his proven faithfulness.

This decision strengthens us all; we have to keep challenging creativity after nearly 16 years of their imprisonment and we know the main objective is still




before us: getting Tony, Ramón and Gerardo out of those prisons.

Solidarity Campaign in UK Denounces Visa Refusal to Cuban Anti-terrorist



8 September 2014

The Cuban solidarity campaign has called for emergency protests

The United Kingdom's Cuba Solidarity Campaign called for demonstrations after British authorities denied a visa to Cuban antiterrorist Rene Gonzalez. Gonzalez, together with his spouse Olga Salanueva, was invited to join supporters in London from September 8 to 10.

The U.K. government rejected three legal injunctions to revoke this decision, despite Gonzalez having received an invitation from 29 British legislators to attend a meeting in parliament, and another from the Trade Union Congress in Liverpool.

Gonzalez's European tour is part of a global campaign to support the Cuban

Five and to oppose terrorism. The tour will run from September 4 to October 6.

Last March, Rene Gonzalez was likewise denied entry by the British government in order to attend a Commission of Inquiry to investigate the case of the Cuban Five, as the group is known. The session took place in the British capital.

September 12 will mark the sixteenth anniversary of his arrest. He and his colleagues Fernando Gonzalez, Gerardo Hernandez, Ramon Labañino and Antonio Guerrero were arrested in 1998. The last three are still behind bars.

Free the Cuban 5 Committee - Vancouver & Vancouver Communities in Solidarity with Cuba Joint Report on the 2014 Peoples' Social Forum in Ottawa, Canada

On Thursday August 21, 2014 the Peoples' Social Forum began at the University of Ottawa on unceded Anishinaabe territory in Ottawa, Canada. Under the banner "Build together, win together! The Future is Ours!" thousands of people gathered from across Canada for 4 days of workshops, assemblies, concerts, art exhibits and a march & rally. In fact over 500 workshops and assemblies took place during the forum, and out of those only one focused on the importance and example of the Cuban Revolution, which was the workshop organized by Vancouver Communities in Solidarity with Cuba (VCSC). There were also two excellent events on the case of the Cuban 5 hosted by the Free the Cuban 5 Committee - Vancouver and Toronto Forum on Cuba respectively. There was a permanent Cuba solidarity table as part of the information fair which was very popular throughout the forum and shared jointly between Ottawa Cuba Connections, Cubacan Co-Op Ottawa, Vancouver Communities in Solidarity with Cuba & Free the Cuban 5 Committee Vancouver. FC5C-Van held the banner for the Cuban 5 high throughout the Unity March as over 2,000 people marched on Parliament Hill.

The first Cuba workshop was on Thursday with the title "Fight for the Cuban 5: Fight for Human Rights." This workshop featured two strong speakers: Don



Foreman, Regional Organizer for the Canadian Union of Postal Workers (CUPW) and Alison Bodine, a Coordinator of the Free the Cuban 5 Committee - Vancouver. The speakers outlined the case of the Cuban 5 and the campaign for their freedom across Canada. Don outlined the great work being done by the Canadian Union of Postal Workers and the history of the union in supporting important social justice causes, such as the fight to free Nelson Mandela. Don also spoke about the success of the monthly protests for the Cuban 5 outside the US Embassy in Ottawa (indeed yesterday September 5th

was the 10th consecutive month this dedicated group has been out in front of the US Embassy in Ottawa for the Cuban 5). Alison spoke about the recent successes in the case and the work Rene Gonzalez and Fernando Gonzalez

have been doing since returning to Cuba and how to build a consistent and coordinated campaign

for the freedom for the Cuban 5 in Canada and around the world. There was a good discussion of some of the accomplishments of the campaign and an inspiring intervention by Julio Garmendía Peña, the Cuban Ambassador to Canada, who was in attendance along with Miraly González González, the First Secretary of the Cuban Embassy in Canada. At the Cuban 5 workshop there were people in attendance representing BC, Alberta, Ontario, Quebec, Nova Scotia and even the US!

The second Cuba workshop was on Friday, August 22 and entitled "5 Decades of the Cuban Revolution". Tamara Hansen, coordinator of VCSC was the featured speaker and simultaneous French translation was done by Azza Rojbi, an executive member of FC5C-Vancouver. Over 50 people packed into the room to participate in the only workshop at the 2014 Peoples' Social Forum with a focus on the Cuban Revolution. Tamara spoke about how to connect the accomplishments of the Cuban revolution to the local, national and international

struggles different groups are working on across Canada. For example, using Cuba as a model in the fight against privatization of healthcare in Canada, in the battle for a more environmentally sustainable future, in the struggle for women's rights, or campaigns for electoral reforms - with almost all social justice issues, connections can be made with the example of the Cuban revolution. It is up to us to keep bringing Cuba as that example and inspiration for how to build a better world. The talk was very well received and many people stayed at the end to buy 10 copies of Tamara's book "5 Decades of the Cuban Revolution: The Challenges of an Unwavering Leadership" or to talk about connecting their struggles to that of Cuba.

The third Cuba event was a film showing of a great speech given by the late Leonard Weinglass, prominent lawyer for the Cuban 5 and other historic political cases in the US. Toronto Forum on Cuba hosted the film showing, which is a comprehensive overview of the deep injustice committed against the Cuban 5. The lecture theater was full and the film was followed by a presentation by Morteza Gorgzadeh of Toronto Forum on Cuba, who also invited Alison Bodine, coordinator of FC5C-Van to explain the work happening in Vancouver and BC. Their talks and the video led to a lively

discussion and many people committing to get more involved in the campaign.

Also, important to mention that during these four days of activities we distributed 3,000 leaflets for the Cuba events, along with FC5C-Vancouver newsletters, postcards, posters, and sold books, buttons and t-shirts.

Through the 2014 Peoples' Social Forum Vancouver Communities in Solidarity with Cuba & Free the Cuban 5 Committee - Vancouver were proud to work with others from Canadian Union of Postal Workers, Ottawa Cuba Connections, Cubacan Co-Op Ottawa and Toronto Forum on Cuba in support of Cuba's self-determination, the Cuban Revolution and to promote the campaign to free ALL our 5 Cuban Heroes.
